Tasks for remote learning - Grades 7-9 | CEFR level B2

#### GESE Grade 7

- In this handout we will practise for the topic phase. The tasks in this handout are based on what you worked on in *Grade 7 Remote Tasks*.
- For our first practice topic preparation task, we will be discussing *environmental problems* our planet faces.
- Read and answer the following questions:

- a) What environmental problems worry you the most? Why?
- b) Do you think it is important to learn environmental management / ecology at school? Why?
- c) What do you do to help the planet at home / school/ in your neighbourhood?
- Voice and Choice! Choose one of the environmental problems listed below and prepare your discussion. Once you have decided what environmental problem you will be discussing, you will choose a discussion topic option:

"If I were a world leader": what would you do to solve this issue?


"I have something to say": what would you say about this problem at a global Summit?

#### Option A


• Look up the meaning of the following saying: "A grain of rice can tip the scale". What do you think it means when talking about environmental concerns?





#### Option B


• Do you think world leaders are responsible for environmental problems? Discuss what you would do if you were one.






#### Option C

• Imagine you have the possibility to discuss an environmental problem at a Global Summit. Think of an environmental problem you are really concerned about and discuss it using the graphic organizer below:





- For a second practice topic preparation task, again you will have the possibility to choose. Read the following discussion options and their guiding questions and then use the graphic organizer provided to organize your ideas and discussion.
  - a) **Being Green (Concerned about the environment)** Changing habits: What things did you use to do that you don't do anymore because you know those habits did not help our planet? Explain the reasons for the change in habits. How have the new habits changed your life? Would you recommend any changes in habits to others? Which ones?
  - b) **Memories:** What things you used to do when you were little do you feel nostalgic about? What things you used to do, you do not do anymore and why? Share an anecdote from those times.
  - c) **Time machine!** If you had a time machine and you could go back in time to any moment of the past what moment would you choose and why? Why was that moment in your life special? Any moment you would not go back to? Explain the reasons.



- What does this job involve? What does somebody who has this job /profession have to do?
- Where does somebody with this job / profession work?
- What is the most difficult thing about this job?
- What is the best, in your opinion, about this job?
- Use the graphic organizer provided to organize your topic discussion. You are also given some reminders to practise the language structures you worked on in the remote tasks.



• After that, make a list of ten questions you would like to ask a person who has this job /profession.




- Interview somebody from your family about his /her profession. Plan the questions you will ask to find out:






• Now look at the following society problems and discuss them in relation to your country:


- Use these questions to guide your discussion:

  - Would you encourage or discourage somebody from living in your country? Why?






#### GESE Grade 9

- In this handout we will practise for the topic phase. The tasks in this handout are based on what you worked on in *Grade 9 Remote Tasks*.
- Pay attention to the following questions and answer them:
  - a) Have you ever been the victim of a crime? (Have you ever been robbed/ mugged/bullied?
  - b) Do you live in a safe area? What do people have to be more careful with?
  - c) What recommendations does your family give you to keep safe when you go out?
  - d) Have you ever had a nightmare in which you were the victim of a crime?
  - e) If you haven't, how do you imagine a nightmare in which you are the victim of a crime would be?
- Choose one of the following options to discuss. A graphic organizer has been provided to help you put your ideas together:
  - a) This happened to me once...
  - b) Once I dreamt this happened to me...
  - c) I wish I hadn ´t...
  - d) I should have listened to my parents when they told me to...





- Now read about a situation in which somebody was the victim of a crime. You may read from a newspaper, from an online paper or simply ask a person you know (family or friend).
- What questions would you ask the victim? What do you think they should have / could have done differently? How do you believe they must have felt as the crime was being committed?
