## Sample Independent listening task 2 - Apples

## Examiner rubric

Give the candidate some blank notepaper.
You are going to hear a short talk about apples. You will hear the talk twice. As you listen, write down some facts about apples on your notepaper, if you want to. Then I'll ask you to tell me five facts about apples. Are you ready?
The task will play twice.
Now tell me five facts you heard about apples.
When the candidate has finished, select three follow-up questions from the list below. Choose three questions which correspond to facts not already reported by the candidate.

## Audio script

Today, we are going to learn about apples. The first apples came from Asia. And now in fact, about half the world's apples grow in China. These days, farmers grow around eighty-five million tonnes of apples. Wow! Now you can buy about one hundred different types in the UK. And did you know, small apples are better for making juice.

And what else? Well, apples today are sweeter than they were in the past. For example, one kind of apple has about seventeen grams of sugar. And another thing, one of the newest types of apple is called the Pink Lady.

The best thing about apples is that they keep you young. And finally, in many old stories, apples meant love. How sweet!
